Preferred name changes #HereAtSAIT

A preferred name is the name an individual wants or has elected to be called, which might be different than their legal name. Preferred names are important to a wide population of students and employees who may choose to go by a different name for reasons such as their cultural background or marital status.

For transgender and non-binary people, preferred names (sometimes called "chosen names") are especially important to affirm their gender identity!
